<b>Cooking Fires</b> (a fire used to cook food that is less than three feet in diameter and two feet in height)	YES	YES	NO
<b>Camp Fires</b> (a fire used to stay warm normally referred to as a campfire. Allowed if they are in permanently constructed fire grates and all outdoor areas are cleared of combustibles. Must be no more than three feet in diameter and two feet in height)	YES	YES	NO

<b>Use of Fireworks</b> (Town of Monument)	NO	NO	NO

<b>Outdoor Welding</b> (with caution)	YES	YES	NO (Unless permitted by EPSO.)
<b>Outdoor Grills for Cooking</b> (includes liquid fuel fired, wood pellets, and charcoal.)	YES	YES	YES (Liquid Fuel Only!)
